

# What to Do If: Detained by ICE

- You have the right to make a phone call. Call your emergency contact.
- Memorize your emergency contact's number. You will not have access to your cell phone.
- You have the right to a lawyer. Have your emergency contact call your attorney.
- Do not sign any papers without talking to a lawyer first.
- Never give false information to police or immigration officials.
- You have the right to remain silent.
- Make sure your *Action Plan* is in place and your family is prepared.

- Find out if you or a family member has an **Order of Removal**
    - Call **1-800-898-7180** and enter your A number (9-digit number).
  - Locate someone in ICE custody online at [www.locator.ice.gov](http://www.locator.ice.gov) and either:
    - Enter the person's name, date of birth, and country of origin or;
    - Enter the person's A number and country of origin.
